Course Description

HCI Thesis

The thesis in the HCI track is focused on labs: milab, ARL, and the Amedi lab.

The work in HCI is very diverse - there is a wide range of methodologies and topics to cover. Therefore, each lab provides various types of support to thesis students:

- attending weekly or bi-weekly lab meetings, where thesis students present their own progress as well as learn about the progress of other research students
- personal meetings with the thesis advisor (it is best to ask your advisor for a weekly or bi-weekly meeting)
- you can ask for personal and team meetings with other lab members, to consult

them on technical issues, methodology, statistics, etc.

In addition to lab specific activities there are joint seminars, several times a year.

An important milestone is writing the research proposal. Your advisor will support you in this process and provide comments on multiple iterations. Your advisor may assign other colleagues or lab members to provide such feedback. Subject to the advisor's request, the thesis coordinator can also provide detailed feedback on the proposal.



Course Goals

The set of thesis guidance activities are intended to provide each student with all the backgorund and tools required for the successful completion of a thesis. The goal is that each thesis is worthy of academic publication in a peer-reviwed conference or journal.



Grading

Thesis grading is outlined in a separate document. There is no grade for thesis grading course, but the process is part of the overall grade as follows.

Working on a thesis is a long proposal with multiple stages. Eventually the final products are graded (the thesis manuscript as well as an oral presentation). However, the as the thesis advisors take an important part in the thesis grading, your progress throught the thesis work can also affect the final grade, e.g., taking part in the activities under "course description".
