This course offers students a general understanding of Shi'a terrorism by particularly focusing on Hezbollah as a hybrid terrorist organization. Additionally, it provides students with thinking tools and models to identify, analyze and understand the patterns of action and trends of hybrid terrorist organizations to help them understand ways to deal with such organizations.

Topics we will discuss during the course

- 1. Iran and Shi'a terrorism: the ideological axis
- 2. The Islamic Revolution: the Iranian policy and its implementation
- 3. The development of a support system for Shi'a terrorism: state level, regional level and

international level.

- 4. The Revolutionary Guards, Quds Force and Hezbollah: the transition from assistance and mentorship to management and control. The expansion of Iranian control over proxy organizations.
- 5. Hezbollah, the development of the terrorist wing up to the Arab Spring: from a revolutionary terrorist organization to a hybrid terrorist organization (Lebanon's time line). Processes and development trends, strategies of action (terrorism and guerilla), mutual influences, and interaction with its immediate environment as well as regional and international systems.
- 6. Hezbollah from the Arab Spring to 2023. The entrance to the Syrian arena: the transition from a Lebanese player to a regional player, and from the concept of resistance to an offensive concept.
- 7. Hezbollah: the axis of organizational development a general map
- 8. Hezbollah: a trend analysis as reflected in the organization's leadership speeches
- 9. Hezbollah: the axis of political development risks and opportunities
- 10. Hezbollah and Israel: between deterrence and battlefield decision
- 11. Hezbollah and Shi'a terrorism in the international arena
- 12. Hezbollah: the link between terrorism and crime



Course Goals

The course will deal with Hezbollah's social and ideological sources in its organizational development processes and the factors influencing these processes in recent decades. In this context, we will analyze the organization's policy in the political, social and terrorist spheres, while examining the strategies of action taken to implement its policy. We will also discuss the relations between Hezbollah, Iran and Syria to understand how they evolve over time.



Grading

A final home exam (80%) and core assignment (20%).

Core Assignment (20%):

The students will be required to write a core assignment in which they will **analyze four speeches** of Sheikh Nasrallah, Hezbollah's general secretary. Four-Five Students will work on a topic. They will choose four speeches of Nasrallah from different years (at least one year between every speech) based on the book "Voice of Hezbollah" and based on Hezbollah site: https://www.english.alahednews.com.lb/

The analysis will be around 5 pages that include the following parameters:

- 1. The speeches' titles.
- 2. The speeches' dates.
- 3. The socio-political context of the speeches.
- 4. Main themes mentioned in the speeches.
- 5. Do you identify any change in the messages delivered in the four speeches?

The assignment includes also: 5-10 slides summarize the speeches and the insights of the writers.

The team will present it in class (4-5 teammates)

Timing: The students will present their findings in class in the last four lessons based on Dr. Azani's decision.
