Taxi

In Morocco, there are two types of cab. The white cabs commonly called "Grand Taxi" and the urban cab or "Small cab". To benefit from a cheap transfer, two solutions are available to you: the collective cabs available in all cities of Morocco: Casablanca, Marrakech, Agadir, Rabat, Essaouira, etc. ... or the services of private cabs online. Collective cabs offer specific routes at a small fixed fare, so for a transfer by large or small collective cab, it is advisable to inquire at the waiting stations corresponding to the desired destination.

Tramway

The tramway is an essential means of urban public transport that meets the growing demand for travel in the Rabat-Salé region. Two tramway lines connect Rabat to Salé, separated by the Bouregreg river. In all, there are 32 stations stretching over 19 km. The tramway connects the city centers of Rabat and Salé on a linear 20 km consisting of 31 stations, and serves the main poles of activity: administrative centers, universities, hospitals, railway and bus stations. Shuttle service
