18 Years of Leadership Development

Building on the legacy of former Israeli Ambassador Shlomo Argov, the Argov Fellows Program in Leadership and Diplomacy seeks to prepare around twenty exceptional Reichman University students in their final year of studies for future leadership positions in Israel and the Jewish world in a wide range of fields. Through a year-long, challenging interdisciplinary curriculum, the program strives to help students acquire the knowledge, tools and skills necessary to work towards meeting the many challenges that Israel faces in today's dynamic global environment.

The program, conducted entirely in English, combines academic training, practical skills, experiential learning and mentoring. Its unique curriculum includes courses, seminars and "hands-on" workshops taught exclusively to Argov Fellows by leading academic and professional experts from around the world. The students participate in study tours to Europe, the United States, Taiwan and Israel. The fellowship year concludes with the public presentation of capstone group policy projects in which the fellows propose their solutions to major challenges facing Israel and the Jewish world.

The Argov alumni have carried on to, among others, eminent fellowship programs such as the Rhodes and Chevening, prestigious graduate programs at the world's top universities and leading positions in the public, private and non-profit sectors. The active Argov Alumni Association connects the program's more than 370 graduates around the world.
