Fellows gain direct exposure to Israel's unusually challenging defense and security situation and to Israel's approaches to counter-terrorism and low-intensity conflict.

ASL Fellows participate in educational and informative field trips and attend lectures that are tailor-made for their program. This is possible even when security clearance is needed in order to enter a particular site, because many Reichman University faculty and staff members have contacts in military units that can provide our fellows with such clearance.

- **Visit** the Gaza-Israel border: Tour the battlefield, receive a current situation update, visit a fighting unit, and experience what it's like to sit in one of the most advanced pieces of armor in the world
- **See** the tools defending Israel during visits to the Israeli Navy and Air Force
- **Understand** the security challenges Israel faces by being in such close proximity to the West Bank when you tour the security fence
- **Grasp** Jerusalem's unique security challenges through a guided tour by a senior Israel Security Agency (ISA) member
- **Observe** Lebanon from the Western Galilee and learn about the origins of the Second Lebanon War and the current situation

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Candidates can come from any academic background, but those with backgrounds in military studies, economic geography, international relations, political science, or history may receive preference.
- Applicants should be under the age of 30 at the time of application, and must be U.S. citizens.
- Candidates' career goals must be in the armed services, diplomatic corps, or government or public service. Those who come from military colleges, A/AF/N ROTC programs, and those with previous government experience may receive preference.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- To apply, send the following documents to valerie.susskind@runi.ac.il:
 - Curriculum Vitae (CV) / Resume
 - Bachelor's Degree Transcripts
 - Copy of Passport
 - Personal Statement - one page essay highlighting your background and professional aspirations
 - ASL Supplemental Essay - one to two page description of your prior activities in the field of military studies, international relations, political science, or history. In addition, describe your career goals in the armed services, diplomatic corps, international relations, or government or public service.
 - Two Recommendation Letters - to be sent directly from the recommender to valerie.susskind@runi.ac.il (can be either professional or academic)
- This application is for both the Anna Sobol Levy (ASL) Fellowship and the MA in Government degree. There is no need to apply separately.
- Application Deadlines:
 - Early Registration - December 31, 2023
 - Late Registration - March 31, 2024
