Orientation & start of classes: 23 September 2024

ELIGIBILITY - LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

ELIGIBILITY

Students must be enrolled as full-time students at the partner institution and be nominated to EBS by their home university.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS: should have completed two years of study before their mobility. However, a detailed study of their profile and academic performance will be taken into consideration.

GRADUATE STUDENTS: students must have completed their undergraduate degree/Bachelor's degree (or equivalent).

GPA: 2 or above. Good academic standing.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

English proficiency: B2 level is required (CEFR [link1](#) / [link2](#)).
Proof of English Proficiency: certificate from home institution, TOEFL iBT 72, IELTS 5,5, Duolingo 100.

LENGTH OF STUDY

One semester/One full year (two semesters)
- One semester: Fall semester (Sept - Dec) or Spring (Jan - April)
- One full academic year: Fall start only (Sept to April)¹.

¹ Please note that several courses offered to international exchange students are repeated each semester. Therefore it may be difficult for some students to take a full academic load during 2 consecutive semesters.

ACADEMIC LOAD - GRADING SYSTEM

A regular full-time academic load is **60 ECTS** per academic year, so usually **30 ECTS / semester**. Each institution may have different requirements for study abroad and students should check with their coordinator / academic advisor.

In the French academic system, grades range from 0 (lowest) to 20 (highest). The minimum passing grade is 10/20 (and the grade 20 is almost never awarded).

COURSE SELECTION

Business courses are taught in English.
The course list will be sent by the international office as soon as it is available.
French as a Foreign Language courses are offered during each semester and students are encouraged to enroll.
Students should check academic requirements regarding course selection with their home institution.

TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

Transcript of Records will be available on each student's personal profile on EBS intranet (once all grades have been processed by the Registrar's Office). If needed, the International Office can email the final transcript to the home institution's international office.

INSURANCE

Before their arrival, all students must provide proof of coverage for:

- Medical / hospitalization

For EU students: European Health Insurance Card can provide proof of basic coverage.

- Repatriation

- Personal liability

N.B.: students enrolled for one academic year should register (free of charges) with the French social security system for basic coverage (more details on Campus France [here](#)).

VISA

It is each student's responsibility to obtain all updated details about their visa application. EBS will provide an official Admission Letter to each student once their complete application has been reviewed and accepted. Visa applications are reviewed by Campus France and French consulates. EBS cannot intervene in the process. Please check **official websites** only:

HOUSING

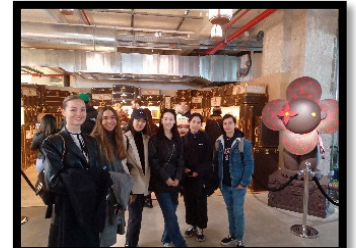
EBS Paris doesn't offer on-campus housing. All students remain responsible for securing and booking their own accommodation.
