

Dr. Idit Kalisher, a senior researcher at the Aaron Institute for Economic Policy at Reichman University, holds a BA (Honors) in Economics and Business Administration, as well as an MA and a Ph.D. in Economics from Ben-Gurion University of the Negev.

Her primary research interests encompass education and human capital, labor economics, and productivity, with her doctoral dissertation delving into the economic and behavioral facets of employment mobility. At the Aaron Institute, Dr. Kalisher focuses on exploring economic disparities within minority communities in Israel, particularly within the Arab and ultra-Orthodox Jewish populations. Her research extends to macroeconomic policies supporting overall economic growth. Previous projects have addressed Hebrew proficiency among the Arab population, barriers to the successful integration of Arabs in academic education and the labor market, promotion of quality employment among ultra-Orthodox Jewish women, and macroeconomic policy. Additionally, Dr. Kalisher is a member of the research team investigating the economic effects of the war of October seventh on Israel.

Beyond her research role, Dr. Kalisher serves as a lecturer for various economics courses at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Outside academia, she is the author of the children's book "In the Forest," using short stories to convey economic principles. Furthermore, Dr. Kalisher actively contributes to developing curriculum in economics for children of all ages, young adults, and parents.
