Our location: St. Louis, Missouri, USA

St. Louis is the birthplace of Jack Dorsey, Chuck Berry and Budweiser—with many big-city attractions, popular national sports teams and a thriving food scene, plus commerce, culture and affordable housing. Ranked the 20th largest metro area in the country, *Forbes* has honored St. Louis as the 7th "Most Affordable City," and St. Louis is a past recipient of the "All-American City Award."

WashU is located across the street from Forest Park, an almost 1,300-acre urban park that's nearly 500 acres larger than Central Park in New York City. Forest Park has 120 miles of paved bikeways, a golf course and five of the region's major institutions: the Saint Louis Art Museum, the Saint Louis Zoo, the St. Louis Science Center, the Missouri History Museum and the Muny amphitheater.

The WashU Olin campus is also located within walking distance of the Loop, twice named "One of the 10 Great Streets in America" by the American Planning Association. The Loop is home to 140 specialty shops, 60 multinational restaurants, 10 galleries, 40 boutiques and 12 entertainment venues.

St. Louis's MetroLink light rail system has 37 stations that connect the airport, WashU, downtown St. Louis, the Cortex Innovation Community and many popular neighborhoods. Each end of WashU's campus has a MetroLink station, allowing for quick travel around the greater St. Louis area.
